September 30: Offering of the Day is for Center of Hope. Center of Hope is an urban ministry that addresses spiritual and material needs by providing faith community nursing, winter clothing, baby supplies for new mothers, bikes to ride to work at minimal prices, as well as a full bike shop for guests. The center welcomes people to adult Bible studies, sports nights for teens and young adults, and a summer Bible camp for children. Pastoral staff engages in street ministry, offers support through a drop-in center, and visits with those in prison.

September 30: Communion Offering is for Rehoboth Christian School. Rehoboth Christian School was founded in 1903 as a ministry to the Navajo and Zuni people of the Four Corners region. Today, Rehoboth serves approximately 70% Native American students, 20% Anglo students, and 10% students of Hispanic descent and other ethnic minorities. Rehoboth is committed to helping students grow into mature Christians intellectually, spiritually, and emotionally.

October 7: Offering of the Day is for the General Fund. The General Fund supports the local ministry programs, including evangelism, youth, children, adult, worship, small group, and health ministries, as well as the operational expenses of the property, office, and personnel expenses.
