This week Pastor Cole Pleggenkuhle will unpack two passages of Scripture from the Gospels of Mark and John. We will see and delight in the Word that became flesh. Our aim is to see Jesus the Son of Man, the suffering servant and His purpose not only in His coming, but in His serving and dying. Drawing from our theme 'SERVE' will be three key points to observe this week from the Scriptures: 1) The established Word, 2) The living Word, and 3) The ransoming Word. Behold, let us remember that God in Jesus Christ came to bear the sin of many.

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Stuff Management

We're six months into having emptied one house to fill another. While the main floor has found some semblance of sanity, and the guest rooms downstairs have some order, the main area of the basement looks like a warehouse... boxes, furniture, etc.... all waiting for their "home" in our home. Except... there's no room for it.

On the plus side, the opportunity presents itself to purge, downsize, and even minimize the "stuff" of our lives. The negative side is that many of those items also have a memory or two attached to them, making it harder to part ways with it.

As I was pondering this dilemma over the last week or so, I was struck by the number of storage buildings going up around our city. We are building buildings to store our "stuff." Now, for certain occasions – namely, a job transfer, an estate settlement, temporary housing situation – such "stuff" buildings have a very useful function.

Yet, many of those buildings will house "stuff" – the overflow of already-full homes – stuff that will be safely tucked away for some ethereal, maybe even mythical, "important" future function. In fact, just recently a TV series was developed where people bid on an abandoned locked storage unit – not knowing its content – but strictly "guessing" what treasures may be stored inside them. Some have landed amazing treasure while others have inherited more "stuff" to add to their "stuff."

Belongings and possessions and valuables and heirlooms and the like all hold some measure of value – maybe sentimental value, monetary value, or legacy value. Sometimes the value is inherent and sometimes it's what we assign to it.

My probing question (or two) for consideration is this: how much time, talent, and treasure are we expending in "stuff" management? Does such energy produce a valuable investment in the areas of life that truly matter – areas that have legacy, long-term, even eternal significance? I ask these questions for the simple purpose of applying Jesus' teaching from the Sermon on the Mount, where He reminds us about how our heart and treasure align, cautions to how much we worry about the "stuff" of this life, and what are we seeking first and trusting Him to supply the rest.

As we navigate this season of gratitude and gift-giving, may your "stuff" management reflect a Kingdom-first objective – purging the unnecessary and truly making room in your home and your heart for the gift of the Messiah.
