SIMDEL Children's Education Ministry - Family visits:

A growing part of SIMDEL Children's Education Ministry has been establishing relationships with the families of some of the students who have been recipients of the education related assistance. Many of these families live a number of miles from the school and village. This distance (up to 6 miles one way) not only makes it difficult for the children to walk to school and back each day, but also makes it difficult for the families to establish and maintain a sustainable income to provide for the basic needs of their families. This year we have been privileged to work with 6 families ranging in size from 2 children up to 11 children. Getting to know these families has allowed us to understand each family's gifts, skills and challenges as it relates to creating a sustainable income. As an example, we have assisted one family with the purchase of a cassava press and a palm nut oil extraction device, helping them produce and store their products for an extended period of time prior to bringing them to the open market.

Hymn of the Month

March's hymn of the month at the 8:30 service is Christ, the Life of All the Living. This hymn text was originally written in German by Ernst Homburg in the mid 17th Century and translated into English by Catherine Winkworth in 1863. It wasn't until the late 18th century that the text and tune (composer unknown) were married as we see in our hymnal today. This is a Lenten hymn referencing the crucifixion and anguish in the garden while also promoting hope and thankfulness. The refrain at the end of each verse is pleasantly stored in my head from childhood and I am confident that we can join together to sing, "thousand, thousand thanks are due, dearest Jesus, unto you".

Song of the Month

March's song of the month at the 10:30 service is Crowns by Hillsong Worship, published in 2016. This song, perfect for this Lenten season, is a celebration of our salvation brought to us by Christ's sacrifice on the cross. As Christians, our identity is found through Christ and his sacrifice on the cross. It is in His sacrifice that we boast. We surrender all of our wealth, achievements, and notoriety at the foot of the cross because our wealth is found through Christ alone. I pray that as a congregation we will continue to daily surrender ourselves and our worship to Christ during this season of Lent and always.

DVR Feature

Can't make it to church? Our Livestream just got better! Imagine this – well, it isn't tough to imagine – you hurry to start watching the livestream on Sunday morning, but you end up running a few minutes late. Rats, I missed it!! ----- But not anymore! Using our new DVR feature, you can go back in time to watch from the beginning. You can also PAUSE the livestream if you need to take a break. This works in all platforms and on all devices.

To watch a livestream event using DVR:

- 1. Go to the Livestream Event page on the website and play video as usual.
- 2. While watching, at any time, you can go back in time on the video to watch from the beginning or rewatch any previous part of the service.
- 3. If you wish to skip forward to watch the live event at the present time, you will see the Skip to live button on the top left corner of the video. The skip to live button takes you to the current moment on the live event.
