SIMDEL Children's Education Ministry - Torch Audio Bibles:

Bringing light both physically and spiritually to the families and their homes in Togo is making a present and eternal difference in the lives of the families we support. Through the Christian teachers and administrators of the public school we have been blessed to partner with a local Christian church to not only distribute the solar powered Torch Audio Bibles in their tribal Ewe language but to start a Bible study for those hearing the Word of God for the first time. The lantern portion of the Torch Audio Bibles provides a source of light in homes previously dark due to no electrical services. And for the many illiterate parents, the Audio Bibles provide a way for many to hear the Word of God in their own tribal language. The distribution of the Torch Audio Bibles went out to 110 families in the village and those residing in the bush surrounding the village. Please join us in prayer as we give thanks for God's promise that: "so is my Word that goes out from my mouth; it will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent

#### **Rest: A Service of Lament and Restoration**

We are about to enter the season of Lent. This is a season in which we set aside special time to focus on our brokenness. Whether sin, shame, hurt, or pain, all are welcome at the foot of the cross. This year we will set aside time for a lament prayer service on **March 10 at 5 pm** in the sanctuary. The service will consist of both hymns and contemporary songs as well as songs for reflection. There will be scripture, prayer, and an opportunity to share of God's faithfulness. Regardless of where you are on your walk with the Lord, all are welcome to attend. #### **Hymn of the Month**

March's hymn of the month at the 8:30 service is Christ, the Life of All the Living. This hymn text was originally written in German by Ernst Homburg in the mid 17th Century and translated into English by Catherine

Winkworth in 1863. It wasn't until the late 18th century that the text and tune (composer unknown) were married as we see in our hymnal today. This is a Lenten hymn referencing the crucifixion and anguish in the garden while also promoting hope and thankfulness. The refrain at the end of each verse is pleasantly stored in my head from childhood and I am confident that we can join together to sing, "thousand, thousand thanks are due, dearest Jesus, unto you".

### Song of the Month

March's song of the month at the 10:30 service is Crowns by Hillsong Worship, published in 2016. This song, perfect for this Lenten season, is a celebration of our salvation brought to us by Christ's sacrifice on the cross. As Christians, our identity is found through Christ and his sacrifice on the cross. It is in His sacrifice that we boast. We surrender all of our wealth, achievements, and notoriety at the foot of the cross because our wealth is found through Christ alone. I pray that as a congregation we will continue to daily surrender ourselves and our worship to Christ during this season of Lent and always.
