PASTOR'S CORNER

To stand or to sit... that is the question. Tis nobler to... be free.

Ok. Ok. Not exactly "Shakespearian", but a thought or two along these lines.

Our worship tradition, stemming back into medieval times, has implemented a variety of rituals and traditions throughout the centuries to accompany our heart-felt, Spirit-led worship. One element of that worship is posture.

Generally speaking: standing indicated reverence, sitting connotated quiet listening, kneeling spoke of solemn surrender. Over time, we've attached these posture elements to the various stations of our worship order. A mix of standing and sitting for singing. Sitting for prayer and the message. Certain traditions still implement kneeling for time of confession and some prayers. And in recent times, a resurgence of standing for the reading of Scripture, a custom from the Old Testament when the Torah or Law was read... with all elements of posture purposed to aid in our worship of God.

The key word is "aid." As the Apostle Paul reminds us that a willing, cheerful spirit (II Corinthians 9:7-8) and a grace-filled approach to the secondary elements of rituals and traditions (Colossians 2:16), is our best "posture" before the Lord and with one another.

All that to say: your standing, sitting, kneeling, raising hands or folding them is not primarily indicative of your spiritual well-being. It may be that you have a physical condition that limits or prohibits you from certain postures. For others, a song or other moment of worship draws you to sit or kneel versus stand with everyone else or raise your hands high or fold them intently/sincerely. The primary concern is the worship of your heart. Physical postures are secondary. We must bless and not second-guess when certain postures are chosen. Our main concern is the heart worshipping God.

Next time you're asked to stand, sit, or kneel – whatever posture you choose – we will trust each other that we are worshipping God first and foremost. Choose freely and be not under obligation. Galatians 5:1,13 CEV

Christ has set us free! This means we are really free. Now hold on to your freedom and don't ever become slaves of the Law again. My friends, you were chosen to be free... Use it as an opportunity to serve each other with love.
