### Fragile - Handle with Care!

Whether mailing something precious or bundling boxes in a move, there are those items with value and breakability that warrant this simple caution: Fragile – Handle With Care!

Often these labels for mailing are bright red, catching the handlers' eyes so that the right amount of care and caution are exercised to ensure your precious cargo gets where it needs to go.

There's an element of our human existence that we sometimes feel warrants said label. A time of trauma or grief or hardship where the pains and problems have tenderized our souls and that we wish for all that is around us would be "handled with care."

We also know that our times and seasons of this life in general warrant the "fragile" label – knowing that in a moment, blink of an eye, our frailty is exposed and our vulnerability is glaring us in the mirror. As I write this, our brother in Christ at First, Rylan, is in the OR room for heart bypass surgery. The Pre-Op felt like a "handle with care" session – pouring over every little jot and tittle of life coming into this: health history, current state of heart and mind, and all the "what-if's" asked, and if possible, answered. A good reminder that we're fragile and need to be handled with care.

While we're not guaranteed in this life of proper "handling" by those around us or in the midst of our trouble, we know The One, who's hands are the most gentle, thoughtful, care-filled hands in the universe. It's a great place to be knowing that when life is fragile, we will be handled with care by His Word and Spirit.

And as much as it is up to us, let's do our part to walk with one another with a sense that life at times feels very fragile, and as followers of Christ, we need to handle each other with love.

### **Hymn of the Month**

The hymn of the month for the 8:30 service during May is "My Only Comfort". The tune may be familiar to you as it is most often used with the hymn "My Shepherd Will Supply My Need". The tune was composed in 1835 but the composer is unknown. The harmonization of the hymn as we sing it today was composed by Dale Grotenhuis in 1990. The text of the hymn is closely connected to Q&A 1 of the Heidelberg Catechism and arranged by Marlene Veenstra in 2003. This hymn will provide us a unique way to confess our faith using the language of the Heidelberg Catechism in song. I hope you enjoy the soaring melody and the rich lyrics as we confess our faith together!

### Song of the Month

The song of the month for the 10:30 service during May is "Yet Not I But Through Christ in Me". This contemporary hymn was written in 2018 by CityAlight. The lyrics of this song of assurance are a celebration of the hope that we have in Christ and the strength that we have through him alone. This simple and effective melody will be sure to have you echoing, "yet not I but through Christ in me" long after we end our service on Sunday!
