#### Fall Sermon Series: Life, Liberty & the Pursuit Of God

This week Pastor Steve continues his 3rd of a 9-part series focusing on the Christian's voice and role in a secular world. The series is divided into 3 sections of 3 messages each.

The first section is "Life". We will talk about the value of human life from God's perspective and how that impacts how we should look at abortion, euthanasia, care for the "least of these", immigration, human sexuality, and gender identity. The second section is "Liberty", with a specific emphasis on matters of stewardship and how Christian liberty should shape our approach to the ethic of work, addressing justice and disparity issues related to poverty and discrimination, and the healthy use of philanthropy to advance a society.

The final section is "Pursuit of God." This section will focus on nurturing our faith to stay focused on Christ, the "author and perfector of our faith", through the storms of secularism and humanism that permeate so much of our present society. We will focus particularly on what it means to witness in the face of silencing, maintaining Christian witness integrity in the face of gaslighting, and deepening hope and resolve in the face of a world longing for a reason to be. This series is "defensive" (ready to stand our ground) as much as it is "offensive" (taking ground for the Kingdom of God). Please join together in prayer for our hearts and lives to be ready and to change where needed so that we are eyewitnesses and willing participants in seeing God's Kingdom and His will being done here on earth and is it in Heaven! ## PASTOR'S PONDERING'S

#### When There's a Gap in the Foundation

This past week we had some work done at our house on the driveway and back concrete patio area. At first glance, one might have thought: this looks simple enough.

Well.... Not so fast.

There's this great technology and scientific advancement that allows for holes to be drilled and a firm substance (first in liquid form) to be pumped underneath the concrete to provide a leveling effect when natural shifts take place. Once the liquid, which converts to a foam-like substance, becomes firm, the concrete is stabilized and strengthened to be walked/driven on. This, combined with some sanding down of the edges, often results in a "new" sense of level and stable.

While this simple process worked well on our driveway, it became far more complicated with the patio. Once holes were drilled into the patio, the foam-pumping began. And they pumped, and pumped, and pumped... and nothing was happening. Turns out, the sagging patio wedged against the house, with the house holding it place, while a one foot gap existed underneath the patio. Had not the house held it in place, we could have lost the patio or worst yet, somebody could have been standing on it and it suddenly give way.

Ouch.

While it took 3-4 times the ordinary amount of liquid/foam to fill the gap, the gap is now filled, the patio is level, and the safety concern removed. Whew!

A simple, relatable story to go with Jesus' teaching on where we will build our lives. Will we build our lives in places that give, shift, and cave from underneath us, or build our lives on the Cornerstone, the unmovable, unshakeable person of Jesus Christ? If your dependence is on the things of this world, you may someday find a large gap underneath what you thought was something you could stand on. That will never happen with Christ.

We were fortunate to catch the lurking danger with our patio. When we stand before God someday, it will be too late to fill in the gaps we allowed in our lives only to find we have no footing to stand on and no reservation in God's presence for eternity.

Check you foundation today – your spiritual one. What are you standing on, depending on, leaning on? Drill some spiritual holes to peak into the out-of-the-way places in your life to see what you're standing on and make sure that you rest on the only foundation that doesn't give way: Jesus Christ.
